I OWE FINES AND COSTS

DAY OF RELEASE: Put a request in with FCP Counselor for a letter showing your start & end date @ FCP (same as your prison ID).

AFTER RELEASE:

Set up a payment plan with the clerk of courts collection department for your fines and costs. Talk to the clerk of courts about deferring payments for time to find employment. *If you were an inmate worker, you may be eligible for jail time credits towards court costs and fines. Check with the clerk of courts.

I OWE CHILD SUPPORT

AFTER RELEASE: Contact Fayette County Domestic Relations, 22 E Main St. Uniontown 15401, 724-430-1260, ASAP to give your new address, discuss your current income/job situation, see if your child support payment plan should be adjusted & arrange payments. Ask them to check that no fees were assessed to you during your incarceration time.

Roadmap to Successful Reentry

This document is to help people preparing for release or recently released from Fayette County Prison (FCP) to have a successful transition from incarceration to the community.

READY FOR RELEASE CHECKLIST

BEFORE LEAVING FCP:

- (2 wks) Request application for Medical Assistance
- (2 wks) Remind family/friend to bring weather-appropriate clothing day of release
- (1 week) Request copy of prison photo ID
- Arrange transportation home

DAY OF RELEASE, YOU SHOULD HAVE:

- 7-day supply of your meds
- All property from your property box
- Debit card for \$ left on FCP account
- Copy of your prison photo ID (if you requested this in advance-see "I NEED IDENTIFICATION")



I NEED HEALTH CARE

APPLY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

2 WEEKS BEFORE RELEASE: If you are on any meds or have physical or mental health needs, submit a request slip to FCP to see Ken Dillinger to begin application. After release, go to Community Action to activate your medical assistance.

MEDICATIONS

DAY OF RELEASE: If you were on meds while at FCP, be sure to request a 7-day supply of your meds on the day of your release from FCP.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

AFTER RELEASE:

If you do not know the date you will be released and are unexpectedly released, go to Community Action to apply.

MENTAL HEALTH AND DRUG AND ALCOHOL SERVICES IN FCP

If you are in need of these services while in FCP. Put a request form in with the FCP Counselor. A referral will be made and evaluations will be conducted.

I NEED A HOME PLAN

Start early to find a home plan. Talk with family or friends about options. If you have no family or friends locally, you may want to investigate structured programs such as the Genesis House.

I NEED CLOTHING

BEFORE RELEASE: If you don't have weather-appropriate clothes to wear on the day of your release, make arrangements with the person who is picking you up to bring appropriate clothes for the weather.

AT RELEASE: Get a copy of your prison ID. Some agencies will accept your prison photo ID as proof of identity. Take it to appointments and to agencies.
